THIS INDENTURE made this 10 nineteenth day December in the year of our Lord Christ one Thousand eight hundred and six, Between James & Rachel Robertson his wife of the County of Campbell of the part, and John Thompson of the County aforesaid of the Other part, witnesseth; that the said James Robertson and Rachel his Wife for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and six pounds Virginia money to them in hand paid by the sd. John Thompson, the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and themselves therewith fully contented have therefore bargained sold aliened enfeafed and confirmed, and by these presents do grant bargain, sell alien, enfeaf and confirm unto the said John Thompson a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in County of Campbell aforesaid, on both sides of Mulberry Creek, a north fork of Falling River and bounded as followeth, to wit; Beginning at a poplar on the said Creek, thence new lines N. forty five Degrees East fifty poles to a pine N. seventy Degrees East seventy four poles to a pine East one hundred and sixty two poles to a scrub white Oak South Twenty eight Degrees East sixty eight poles to a pine south forty six poles crossing the said creek to a Small Red Oak South fifty two Degrees west, one hundred and Twenty eight poles to a shrub white Oak West one hundred and Twenty poles to a shrub White Oak N. thirty five Degrees west one hundred and thirty six poles to a pine N. twenty eight Degrees East Ten poles crossing the said Creek to the first station, Containing in the whole, Two hundred and forty five Acres, by patent be the same more or less, to have and to hold, the aforesaid Tract of Land with all the appurtenances and advantages thereunto belonging, unto the said John Thompson his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever, and the said James Robertson and Rachel his Wife doth hereby covenant and agree with the said John Thompson that him his heirs, Executors Administrators and assigns shall peaceably hold Occupy and possess the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land Clear and free

from them the said James Robertson and Rachel his Wife their  
heirs Executors Administrators and assigns, and from the lawfull  
Claim or Claims of any other person or persons whatsoever, and  
by these presents shall and will warrant the same as before  
mentioned forever.
