# Life of Growing Service Marks Farmville College

Not only is Farmville State Teachers' College the oldest in the state, but it is found that a woman's college has been located in Farmville for nearly a hundred years. In point of view of teacher-training, Farmville is forty-eight years old, but in point of view of education for women it is twice as old, and one of the oldest women's colleges in Virginia and the South.

The first teacher-training institution in Virginia was established by the legislature in 1884, and located at Farmville, a small town in Southside Virginia. It was incorporated under the name of the State Female Normal school. That Farmville secured the school was due to the fact that the town donated to the state the buildings and grounds of what was then known as Farmville College, a small plant occupying less than half a square of ground.

One hundred and ten students were enrolled the first year and the growth from the outset has been steady, making necessary from time to time the enlargement of accommodations.

Since its establishment the college has had only four presidents. First: Dr. William Henry Ruffner, who was the first superintendent of public instruction in Virginia. Dr. Ruffner served for three years and was followed by Dr. John Atkinson Cunningham. Dr. Cunningham gave himself absolutely to his work for ten years and, in 1897, died in service.

Dr. Cunningham was followed by Dr. Robert Frazer, who resigned his position in 1902 to accept that of field agent of the general education board.

The fourth president of State Teachers' College, Dr. Joseph L. Jarman, has served much longer than all of the others combined; he has rounded out thirty years of faithful, efficient service, and has placed the institution in the very front rank of the teachers' colleges of the country.

When Dr. Jarman entered upon his duties in 1902 he found a small school with a faculty of thirteen members, offering three years of academic (or high school) work, and one year of professional work. In that year there were only fifty-eight students in the professional course; today the enrollment is in the neighborhood of a thousand.

Under the former presidents, the very small building that had been donated for the beginnings of the normal school had been added to several times, but the plant in 1902 was still insignificant. From this small beginning has risen the splendid college of today, with its beautiful buildings, its standard college courses, its up-to-date campus training school and five rural training schools, its able faculty and its thousands of loyal alumnae scattered over the nation. The State Teachers' College at Farmville is a member of the American Association of Teachers' Colleges, and of the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Among the many changes that have taken place during the administration of Dr. Jarman, it is noted that the name of the institution has been changed twice. The State Female Normal school existed as such from 1884 to 1914 when the Virginia legislature changed it to State Normal School for Women at Farmville. In 1916 the privilege of conferring degrees was granted, and in 1924 it became the present State Teachers' College at Farmville.

During the administration of President Jarman the campus has been extended from time to time until it now occupies approximately twelve acres in the heart of the town. In addition to the campus proper the college has recently acquired "Longwood," a beautiful colonial home situated just a mile from the campus and surrounded by eighty-five acres of grounds. "Longwood" is famous as the home of General Joseph E. Johnston and of Dr. Charles Venable, for many years chairman of the faculty of the University of Virginia; this lovely spot is a great addition to the college since it serves as a recreation center for the students who enjoy the beauty and rest of the handsomely furnished old home and its surroundings.

The development of the student at Farmville is not considered complete with classroom instruction alone; an all-sided development is the aim of the administration — development along the special line of teaching, development for citizenship, for the moulding and strengthening of character, for community work, and a development of the spiritual side.
