S. M. A. Wins Victory.

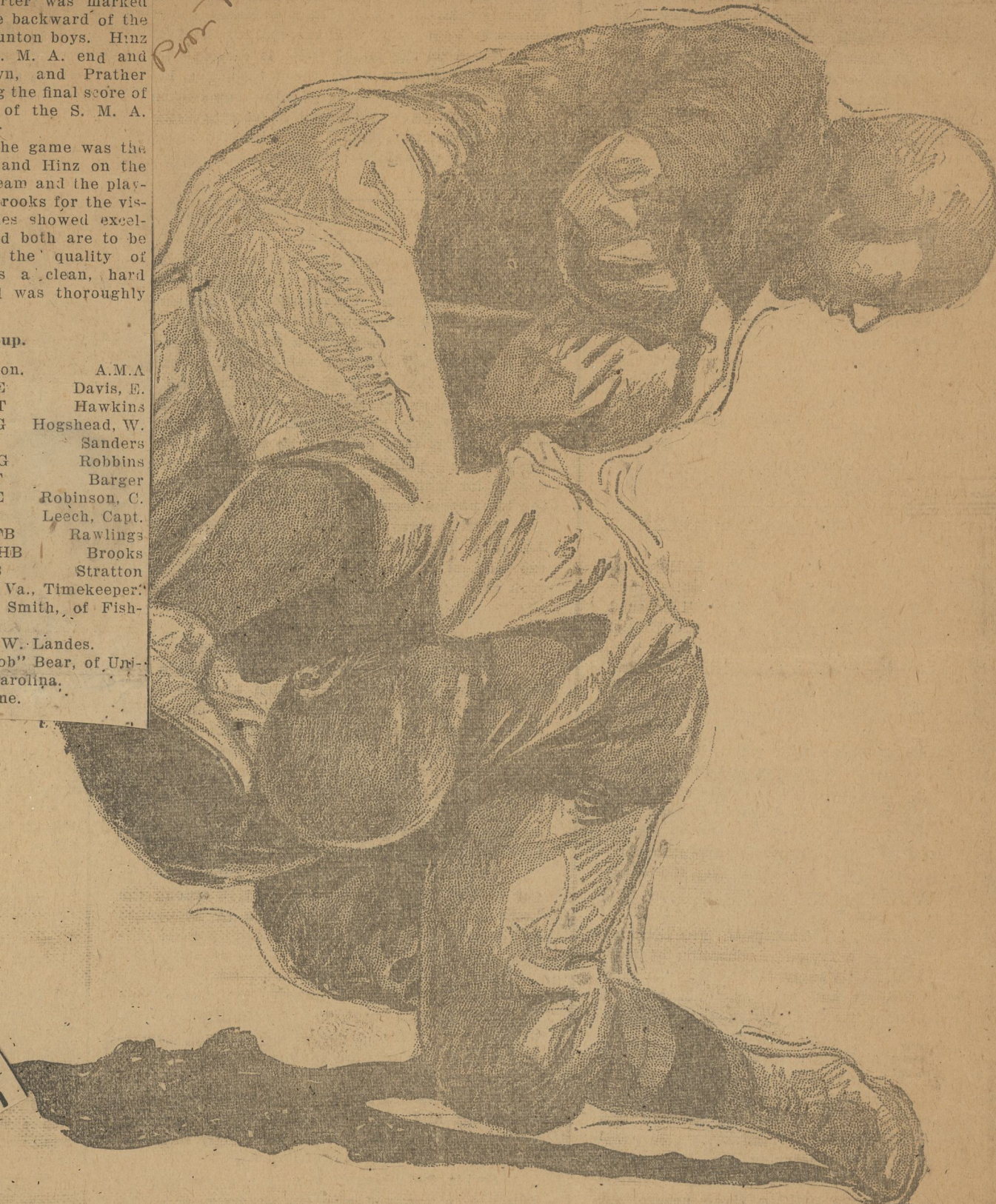
