Very surprised I was when the two parcels with the books arrived. Many thanks for your sending by air-mail.

The volums 30-37 I delivered to our Cantonal Bibliothec in Chur. Mthe manager, Mr. Dr. J. Jörg, has written you a fine letter dated 20st of this month. He would be very thankful if the bicliothec could get also the missing volums 24-29? May it be, that your firm has already despatched those books, but that they dead not reach me? - Like Mr. Dr. Jörg I and my wife Annie would be happy to have again your and your peoples visit.

The separate sent volum Nr. 19, I sent it to the Johanna Spyri Museum in Hirzel. The president of that foundation, Mr. Bïrg Winkler, let have me what you will find enclosed to this letter. He really is enjoyed to have now that volum 19 and he presents you his best wishes and thanks. In small equivalent he asked me to send you one exemplary of his owen book with dedication to you.

On December 29th arrived your small book giving notice of the E. Landells' illustrated guide called "Boys own toy-maker". We find it very kind and usefull that you and your wife and sons are proposing to buy also this book, enstead toys of war imitations, as there are guns, rifles, colts, tanks, etc. - Fine your and yours doing. - Our grand-children do not have such toys.

Out of the letter of the president of J.S.-Museum, Mr. J. Winkler, you may sea, that he would be very thankful if his owen book could be sold also in USA. One exemplary of that book you will get by separate mail despatched to-day also. Are <sup>you</sup> interested to get the Copy-rights? We hope it may be so.

An other book, about Maienfeld "how it was once and how it is now" is joint to my sending. Would there be a possibility to sell it also in USA, may it be as it is now, in our language, or translated by your crowd in your speaking?

To close, I and my wife would be happy to have your visit again and also of your Mary Ann, your sons, your related peoples.
