Liberal Studies: Program Change

This change is in response to the new Virginia licensure requirements that remove licensure for N,K-8 and now require separate licensure for n, K-6 and 6-8. The previous program for N,K-8 now becomes the program for N,K-6 and the proposal is for an add-on endorsement for licensure for 6-8.

Middle School teaching endorsement (for teaching in two areas of concentration), Grades 6-8.

Students wishing endorsement to teach in grades 6-8 must complete, in addition to the Liberal studies courses listed above, the designated course in at least two of the areas listed below. They must also complete the professional education requirements for Middle Education.

English: 6 additional credits

Engl 350: Introduction to Linguistics

Engl 381: Young Adult Literature

Mathematics: 6 additional credits (Math 451 replaces Liberal Studies Elective)

Math 164 Pre Calculus (3cr) or Math 261 Calculus (5cr - but exempts General Education Math Goal 4)

Math 451 - Teaching of High School Mathematics (3cr) (Replaces Liberal Studies Elective)
