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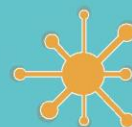
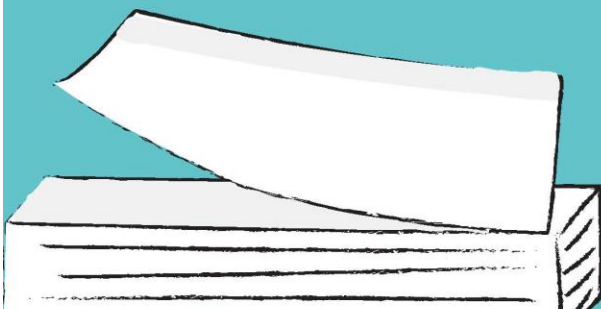

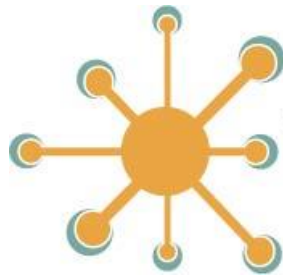

Opening Remarks – Dr. Larissa Smith Fergeson

Larissa Smith Fergeson is the University's Interim Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs, overseeing faculty and staff in Longwood's four academic colleges and the Cormier Honors College.

Dr. Fergeson has been at Longwood since 2000. As a professor of history, she specializes in 20th century African-American history, history of the U.S. South, and Virginia history. She chaired the Faculty Senate from 2010-13, and served on the SACSCOC Reaffirmation Executive Committee, which culminated in Longwood's most recent reaffirmation. In 2014 she was named the university liaison to the Robert R. Moton Museum and served as vice chair of the Academic Core Curriculum Committee which revised the general education program. In 2015 she served as Associate Provost for Outreach Programs and Initiatives.

She holds a bachelor's degree in political and social thought from the University of Virginia, and an M.A. and Ph.D. in American History from Emory University.

Twice alumna Dr. Sarah Tanner-Anderson obtained her Bachelor of Arts ('02) in English and her Master of Arts ('07) in English, Education and Writing from Longwood University. After Longwood, Dr. Tanner-Anderson went on to obtain her Doctor of Education from The George Washington University ('14) in Educational Administration and Policy Studies, where she explored barriers, struggles and triumphs of female educational leaders. She attributes her love of learning and research to the foundations she built while at Longwood: writing undergraduate literary analysis and criticism essays, which led to conducting an action research study for her master's thesis, that then ultimately sparked an interest in pursuing doctoral study and scholarly research.



Scholarship and service go hand-in hand; Dr. Tanner-Anderson, a member of many local, state and national professional organizations has presented at professional and academic conferences and conducted instructional workshops centered around literacy, leadership and engagement. She serves as Higher Education Representative for Women Education Leaders of Virginia (WELV) and Region 8 Representative for Learning Forward Virginia. Dr. Tanner-Anderson has a wide range of experience in K-12 education, including teacher, coach, club sponsor, department chair, grade-level chair, assistant principal and principal. Fall 2017 she joined the Longwood faculty as Assistant Professor and Program Coordinator for Educational Leadership and is redeveloping the educational leadership master's program.

Dr. Tanner-Anderson resides in her hometown of Amelia, Virginia, with her husband, Peyton Anderson ('03), whom she met at Spring Weekend in 2002. After sixteen years, these college sweethearts remain testaments to lasting Lancer love. They have one son, William, who is a Longwood Legacy, although at 4, he may not know it yet. Dr. Tanner-Anderson enjoys spending time with family, canoeing, running and reading.

Keynote Address - Dr. Robert Northington

Dr. Northington grew up in a rural farming community in Lunenburg County, Virginia. After graduating high school in 1999, he began his undergraduate studies at Longwood to become a high school biology teacher.

During his Freshman year at Longwood, Dr. Northington became involved in a small local research project in the Appomattox River with two Longwood faculty, which inspired him to continue to explore undergraduate research opportunities beyond Farmville. At the urging of several Longwood professors, he applied for, and was accepted into, a National Science Foundation Research Experience for Undergraduates (REU) researching environmental toxicology on Lake Michigan. He continued his research in freshwater ecology for the rest of his time at Longwood, ultimately leading to his acceptance into graduate school at UNC-Greensboro, where he received a Master of Science in 2005. Between his Master's and Ph.D., Dr. Northington worked for three summers on the North Slope of Alaska studying arctic lakes. Dr. Northington returned to Virginia, where he earned a Ph.D. in aquatic ecology from Virginia Tech in 2013.



Currently, Dr. Northington is a Research Assistant Professor in the Climate Change Institute at the University of Maine, conducting research on freshwater ecosystems in both Maine and Greenland.
