The Longwood College mace was presented to the college by Zeta Tau Alpha in 1974 in commemoration of the 75th anniversary of the sorority's founding at the college in 1898. The 38-inch mace, designed in the form of a lily, was created by Stanley Lechtzin, a goldsmith and jeweler with the Tyler School of Art at Temple University in Philadelphia.

GRADUATED WITH HONORS

Longwood College recognizes superior scholarship through the Dean's List and the announcement of honor graduates at Commencement. In order to qualify for graduation honors a student must have completed at least 60 credits at Longwood; the average used for determination of honors is the cumulative grade point average on all work taken at Longwood. Those students whose cumulative averages are 3.35 or above are graduated with the following honors:

SUMMA CUM LAUDE 3.75 - 4.00

MAGNA CUM LAUDE 3.55 - 3.74

CUM LAUDE 3.35 - 3.54
