#### Visiting Professorships:

"The titles of Visiting Assistant Professor, Visiting Associate Professor, and Visiting Professor are courtesy titles to be given to faculty visiting from another institution of higher education who are on temporary assignment to Longwood University. A visiting faculty member usually is associated with a department or school for a short time, normally not in excess of one year. Visitors may be researchers, teachers, public service scholars, or any combination thereof. Normally, the visitor is given the equivalent professional rank held at the home institution. Tenure is not awarded to visiting faculty. Individuals appointed at these ranks may be invited to participate in, but are not eligible to vote on, faculty matters. A visiting faculty appointee can become a regular appointee only through a search process before or after the initial appointment in accordance with the institution's procedures, including adherence to affirmative action quidelines."
